Supervisor Keys called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. with the Pledge to the Flag.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 70 OF 2021 APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On a motion of Councilman Becker, seconded by Councilman Aucter, the following resolution was ADOPTED Ayes 5 Becker, Aucter, Buell, Lyndaker, Keys Nays 0

RESOLVED, the minutes of the July 12, 2021 meeting are approved.

### SITE PLAN REFERRAL

Lewis County Planning Board reviewed the referred Site Plan Review and Zoning Permit Application No. 2-2021, submitted by Jordan Brandt, for the proposed expansion of Red Barn Meats and construction of an approximately 32,000 sq. ft. building on property located at 9095 and 9097 Briot Rd., Town of New Bremen, NY, Tax Map No. 147.00-01-18.100 and 147.00-01-18.210, at their July 15, 2021 meeting and submitted their letter of approval with five (5) conditions listed. After discussion, the following resolution was presented.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 71 OF 2021**

### SITE PLAN REVIEW& ZONING PERMIT APPLICATION NO. 2-2021

On a motion of Councilwoman Lyndaker, seconded by Councilman Aucter, the following resolution was ADOPTED 4 Becker, Aucter, Lyndaker, Keys Recusal 1 Buell Nays 0

WHEREAS, that pursuant to General Municipal Law, Article 12-B, Section 239-M, the County Planning Board did review Site Plan Review & Zoning Permit Application No. 2-2021 – Red Barn Meats/Jordan Brandt, 9095 Briot Road, Town of New Bremen, for a 32,000 sq. ft. expansion to the existing facility at said location, Tax Map No. 147.00-01-18.100 and 147.00-01-18.210, and

WHEREAS, the County Planning Board did approve the application with conditions, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, the New Bremen Town Board "approves" Site Plan Review & Zoning Permit Application No. 2-2021, contingent upon the applicant complying with the following conditions set forth by the County Planning Board:

- 1. The proposed parking lot, access points and load dock area should be reevaluated to comply with Article 5 and the Town Highway Superintendent should review the proposed entrances to ensure traffic safety standards are met.
- 2. While the number of parking spaces does not meet the requirements of the Town of New Bremen Site Plan Review Law, the Town Board and applicant should evaluate the proposed number of parking spaces and agree to a suitable quantity based on the number of expected employees and customers.
- 3. Motion sensor and/or timer outdoor lighting should be added to the exterior of the building and parking area.
- 4. Before commencing construction activity, the applicant must work with NYSDEC to obtain the proper permits and copies should be given to the Zoning Enforcement Officer.
- 5. Compliance with all Local, State and Federal, to include USDA, regulations for this type of facility.

# **OPEN PUBLIC HEARING**

The Public Hearing for Site Plan Review & Zoning Permit Application No. 3-2021, Village of Lowville for the proposed development of the Village of Lowville Groundwater Project, Town of New Bremen, NY, Tax Map No. 182.00-02-08.121 and 182.00-02-10.000, was declared open at 6:38 p.m. Proof of publication in the J&R noted.

### **FLOOR - DISCUSSION**

Patrick Morse, 7646 Number Four Rd., Town of New Bremen – stated that the Village of Lowville Groundwater Project is going through his property and upon his review of the site plan, noticed that the applicant did not list his parcel on their application; and therefore feels it is incomplete and should be denied and/or tabled until updated. Mr. Morse is also upset with the Village of Lowville concerning a previous water project where they left large rock piles on his property and exceeded their fifty (50') right-of-way. He presented the Board with a map and photo of the damage left from the previous project. He is asking for the Board's assistance in the matter.

Councilwoman Buell – the Board can't address the past issue as it's not part of this project. The application for this project was accepted by the Town Board at our July 12<sup>th</sup> meeting and has been referred to the Lewis County Planning Department for their recommendations; and are aware of Mr. Morse's parcel not being listed on the application. The Town Board would be advised to approve with conditions.

Matthew Cervini, GYMO engineering firm – stated he has spoken with Mayor Beagle on the situation and that Mayor Beagle sent a letter to Mr. Morse about his concerns. Mr. Morse gave a copy of said letter to Supervisor Keys.

Discussion followed – it was suggested that the Village be asked to clean up the mess left from the previous project while they are on-site for the new construction, would save money as they are already there. Would it be possible for the Village to use ARPA funds to help cover the cost of the clean-up?

The Board asked Supervisor Keys to send a letter to the Village of Lowville advocating for the clean-up of Mr. Morse property and make them aware that their site plan application failed to include Mr. Morse property. The County Planning Board will review said referred application at their August meeting and forward their recommendations for the Town Board's final consideration of approval at the September 13<sup>th</sup> meeting. GYMO representatives left at 6:58 p.m.

### **CLOSE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

All questions and concerns by the public were addressed. Therefore, the public hearing was hereby closed at 6:54 p.m.

### **OPEN PUBLIC HEARING**

The Public Hearing for proposed Local Law No. 2 of 2021 entitled "A Local Law to Opt Out of Allowing Cannabis Retail Dispensaries and On-Site Consumption Sites as Authorized under Cannabis Law Article 4", was declared open at 6:58 p.m. by Supervisor Keys, with proof of publication in the Journal & Republican noted.

### **FLOOR - DISCUSSION**

Noted that the proposed local law is subject to permissive referendum and in order to have a referendum, a petition must be filed within 45 days of the local law being enacted. Petitions would need to be submitted to the Town Clerk and include the signatures of 10% of people who voted in the last election for Governor in the Town of New Bremen.

Mary Meyer, 8428 Mattis Rd., Town of New Bremen – feels the Board should consider retail shops and that it's time to open up shops to regulate sales of cannabis which could help protect against bad or laced cannabis being purchased on the street.

Peter Meyer, 6469 Erie Canal Rd., Town of Watson – is in agreement with Mrs. Meyer and that the Town Board should give it a chance.

Councilwoman Buell – acknowledged the Town Board has discussed this issue for several meetings and feels the need to be cohesive. If the Town Board "opts in", we can never "opt out". She is uncomfortable, as there are no regulations as of yet and feels it is being pushed through too quickly by the state. If down the road things are regulated thoroughly the Town Board can "opt back in".



Councilman Aucter – feels it could have adverse effects on local businesses and overall health of our community.

Patrick Morse, 7646 Number Four Rd., Town of New Bremen – stated he is a federal firearm dealer and pointed out several issues that could occur with the use of cannabis and ownership of a firearm by an individual. He agrees with the Board's decision to "opt out" at this time. As does, Holly Aucter – 6966 Kirschnerville Rd., Town of New Bremen.

All questions and comments by the public were addressed; the public hearing was hereby closed at 7:20 p.m. by Supervisor Keys.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 72 OF 2021 ADOPTING LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF 2021 LOCAL LAW TO OPT OUT OF ALLOWING CANNABIS RETAIL DISPENSARIES AND ON-SITE CONSUMPTION SITES AS AUTHORIZED UNDER CANNABIS LAW ARTICLE 4

On a motion of Supervisor Keys, seconded by Councilman Aucter, the following resolution was ADOPTED Ayes 5 Becker, Aucter, Buell, Lyndaker, Keys Nays 0

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of New Bremen held a public hearing on August 9, 2021 for proposed Local Law No. 2 of 2021, at which time public comment was heard, and

WHEREAS, the Town of New Bremen acting as Lead Agency has determined that said local law is a Type II action and will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of New Bremen hereby adopts Local Law No. 2 of 2021 entitled "A Local Law to Opt Out of Allowing Cannabis Retail Dispensaries and On-Site Consumption Sites as Authorized Under Cannabis Law Article 4", and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this law is subject to permissive referendum following the procedure outlined in Municipal Home Rule Law § 24.

Mr. Meyer thanked the Board for their time and left the meeting at 7:20 p.m.

### **COUNCIL/ARPA FUNDS DISCUSSION**

Councilman Aucter – suggested using ARPA funds to rehab the highway garage due to the past usage of the highway garage to hold town board meetings to provide for social distancing due to COVID. Discussion followed. Highway Superintendent Herzig was asked to write up a list of possible improvements to support Mr. Aucter's idea.

Tom Kalamas and John Jones, members of the Croghan Town Board – the Beaver Falls Water District is looking for assistance to offset the cost of replacing a water line on Cut Off Road – with an estimated cost of \$150,000.00. Brian LaChausse, Commissioner of the BFWD, sent a letter to all board members in hopes of obtaining some of the ARPA funds New Bremen would be receiving to help cover the cost of the new water line. Water and sewer infrastructure projects are eligible projects for the use of ARPA funds.

Councilwoman Buell and Lyndaker are willing to use some of New Bremen's ARPA funds towards the project. They would like a formal letter requesting said funds for the project along with an estimated cost of the project. The Board will work as a whole to determine what the funds will be spent on.

NBCIA – still have not received a response from Robin Houppert, President. Councilwoman Lyndaker offered to contact Mrs. Houppert for more information and possibly attend the next meeting. Councilwoman Buell suggested contacting Attorney Farley about the NBCIA as it is a 4013C organization (nonprofit); unsure if the Town could take it over. Supervisor Keys doesn't see it being financially sustainable. Discussed bidding out the concession stand and operation of the field.

## HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT

Highway Superintendent Herzig reported on the following:

- 1. MEO/Laborer Looking to fill position, placed help wanted ad and receiving applications through the 18<sup>th</sup> of August. Also, changed requirements to work towards obtaining their CDL if they do not obtain one already.
- 2. Paved Briot Rd. and helping other Towns with paving.
- 3. New Pickup no definite delivery date as yet.
- 4. Tandem in the build process as of 8/2/21.
- 5. Tree Removal Asked the Board for input on how to handle roadside trees that need removing and are too big for the highway department to handle safely. Have used Virkler's Tree Service in the past and are very reasonable. Discussed – Board agreed that Highway Superintendent Herzig is to use his judgment and follow the Towns procurement policy.
- 6. New Holland Tractor is a 2008 and having continued issues with it. Currently leaking oil in the rear-end. Discussed replacing it.

### SUPERVISOR CORRESPONDENCE

Supervisor Keys reported on the following:

- 1. ARPA Funds Received first half \$121,097.12 and opened a separate account in which the money was transferred into.
- 2. 2022 Budget Budget requests have been handed out. Please have returned to Supervisor by early September.
- 3. 2022 Retirement Contribution Supervisor asked to transfer funds from the Retirement (contribution) Reserve Fund to offset cost for 2022 employer contribution for the NYSLRS. Said transfer is subject to a permissive referendum. Resolution to follow.
- 4. AIS Spoke with new owners for the speedway, are possibly interested in purchasing the old town landfill on Artz Road to put office and/or visitor center. Discussion Councilman Aucter asked whether National Grid was still interested in leasing the land. Councilwoman Buell has not heard back from Jerry Haenlin, Manager of NG, but will reach out to him to see if they are still interested.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this Resolution shall be subject to permissive referendum as required by law.
